

What? The 2014 DE season is almost over and you didn't sign up for even one day of real fun on the track? How did that happen? Well, not to worry because if you are reading this as soon as it arrived in your mailbox, you still have enough time to register for our two days at Watkins Glen, on the 13th and 14th of October, 2014.

If WGI would be your first time doing a DE, you are starting with the best of all the tracks we visit. What a way to get started with DE! I sure hope that you give it some thought and then look at the calendar as the event falls on a Monday/Tuesday (Monday is Columbus Day so only one day off from work). We have a dinner on Monday night, following the first day on the track, where everyone comes together to trade stories (and do some bragging about their day of driving). It is always a terrific event.

If you don't think that WGI is going to work out for you, we have two half days left in November at Lime Rock Park. Friday November 7th is for Advanced Drivers (White/Black/Red) and we will be running the same format that we tried in August (the feedback was very positive) - we will be on track from 9 a.m. - 1 p.m. The first rungroup will run for a half hour, the second rungroup will run the next half hour. And then back to the first rungroup, etc. So, a whole DE day's worth of driving condensed into half a day. Everyone will get two hours of track time and can be home in the early afternoon, to hang with the family, rake the leaves, or start cleaning the car for winter storage.

Saturday, November 8th is also at Lime Rock Park (LRP), for our Beginner Drivers (Green/Yellow) and of course, our instructors. We will be sharing the track with the members of Club Lime Rock and will have the track every other

RALLY — IT'S NOT JUST THE CARS, IT'S THE INSTRUCTIONS!

In a just a few days, about 20 CVR rally teams, each in one of their favorite Porsches, will hit the roads North and West of Canton, CT for a three part rally featuring rural (part one), open country (part two) and urban (part three) roadways. Each part of the rally will have rules/procedures to match the types of roads the rally is using. For example, in part 2 (on the open country roads), there will be scenic items to note as you whiz on by (at higher speeds), but there will not be instruction traps based on road name changes, quoted signs and other things that require going slow or reversing direction to properly execute. In part 1 (on the rural roads near Canton), any of the usual traps based on properly reading signs, executing the infamous "onto" instruction (where you must not leave a road you are placed "onto" unless instructed to do so), going the appropriate way at uninstructed T intersections, etc. are fair game. Finally, in the final urban part of the rally, we will again try to limit things like U-turns, finding obscure signage and the like. In the busiest road (through Bristol), nothing will be required as it will be designated a "free zone".

The rally route is a little less than 70 miles long (assuming you stay on course), but a good 30 miles of it is on the higher-speed, scenic numbered highways that circle the Barkhamsted reservoir, so the time to complete the rally should still be comparable to our previous

rallies, beginning about 9 and having everyone arrive at the finishing venue by 12 or 12:30. As noted in the last two Challenges, this rally will start at the Dunkin Donuts on Route 44 on the Canton/Simsbury line and finish at the Wood-N-Tap restaurant on Queen Street (Route 10) in Southington.

> IMPORTANT! If you haven't registered for the October sth rally, you need to do so now! (It is too late to register via mail, but you can email Rally@cvrpca.org to see if there are any spots left.)

At the time of this writing, I am still taking pictures of interesting objects and places along the rally route for teams to both record for scoring and as well as derive some directions from. There will be at least 2 checkpoints (possibly 3) on >>>continued on page 26

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the rally. Each rally team will receive two CVR participation gifts, commemorating the rally. Winners (in 2 classes) will receive engraved plaques.

ZONE 1 AUTOCROSS

CVR took a big step on August 23-24. We earned a third place finish in the Regional Challenge at the Zone 1 Autocross event. We've all been working hard to sharpen our driving skills for several seasons now and this finish validates that journey. There are a lot of really good drivers in Zone1 and now we can again count ourselves as part of that statement. What makes this even more significant was that for 70% of the CVR team, this was their first Zone1 Autocross and vet they drove like seasoned veterans. Not so serendipity, the August 10th CVR AutoX featured the perfect two AutoX-U driving skills to prepare us all for the tough competition found each year at the Moore Air Field classic

Acceleration and Focus driving skills had been carefully saved for the sixth CVR AutoX held on August 10th and the course was custom-designed to accentuate these. In the process, the course set two records. It was both the longest and fastest CVR AutoX in the decade that we have been running at the LAZ lot in Hartford. Wow! It was also the perfect prep for what turned out to be a record fast Zone1 course on Saturday, August 23rd (which was more like the Thompson Speedway Motorsport Park

event CVR had recently run). The CVR AutoX was also prefect prep for the slalom-heavy Zone1 course on Sunday, August 24th, both having 25 pace (fast) slaloms to test driver and car alike. Also not so coincidentally, both the CVR and the Zone1 courses took almost exactly the same amount of time to cover (about 60-70 seconds). I never thought I'd be able to say that!

CCVR is definitely on the right path to keep climbing the Zone1 podium and

we have renewed hope for reclaiming our prior "ownership" of this event. The best way to get there is to keep having fun and to keep learning, which is why these are pillars of the CVR AutoX program. Focus was one of the August 10th AutoX-U featured skills. It was directly helpful for that long CVR course as well as the following Zone1 Autocross course two weeks later. Then a week after that, when Sir Stirling Moss was CVR's honored guest speaker during the Lime Rock Historic Festival, he was asked a very interesting question. "What attribute was needed to be a fast driver"? His answer may have seemed a little puzzling to some and maybe a little disappointing to others, but was right in line with the prior AutoX-U lesson on "Focus". It was too coincidental to pass up a deeper look...

"To be fast," Sir Moss replied "you need to keep some reserve." Not as flamboyant as the reply James Hunt quipped in the movie "Rush" but directly aligned with Nicki Lauda's reply in the same movie. Also directly in line with the **AutoX-U** driving lesson on Smooth driving and it's closely related skill of





Focus. In both skills you need to think ahead of, and faster than, your car. You should always be waiting to give your next input to your car. As Sir Moss said, to have "reserve".

At face value, you would think the reserve is just so you don't crash. True, but it goes deeper than that, and it strikes at the

essence of being fast. The reserve allows you to go to that Zen space where you stop thinking about vour driving so consciously and just "feel the driving". The reserve allows you to drive really fast, knowing, really knowing, that you will be able to control your vehicle at a previously unthinkable speed. You get a rhythm and a confidence that only comes from being so far "ahead" of your actions. This reserve gives you plenty of time to make all of the micro-adjustments (catches) that happen when the tires are truly at their non-linear, twitchy edge of adhesion. The reserve to fly.

Ok, ok, that sounds very poetic but what the heck does "reserve" mean in practice? Here is an example of how to think about it from the August 10th course point-by-point through the chicane (see picture):

($\mathbf{0}$) Well before the chicane your foot was planted to the floor. As you fly towards the chicane you are not panicked by the acceleration or the building speed because you are Focused on spotting the landmark cones at point 2. You keep your foot flat as you are waiting, waiting, waiting for your next input. In real clock time the wait is only 1-2 seconds long, but your brain processes thoughts much, much faster so the "waiting" seems like slow motion. This is your first reserve.

♦ 1) Now!... just before point 1, you quickly ramp-up the brake pedal pressure to a high, but not maximum, level. You are aiming to lose only a little speed (maybe 20 mph) but you are really focused on shifting enough weight to the front tires to prepare them for their next command. Now!... when you reach your "turn-in point" you simultaneously "trail" off of the brakes in harmony with quickly turning to your pre-calibrated steering

wheel angle to flick the car to the next point. The rate at which you turn the wheel is matched to the rate at which you release the brake pressure. Your reserve is the release point of the brakes. If your car doesn't turn-in as much as you need, you keep "milking" the release of the brake pressure a little deeper. This keeps a little extra weight on the front tires allowing them to finish their task of turning the car. This reserve allows you to make micro-adjustments to compensate for the off-camber road surface and the poor traction from dust and old pavement.

The reserve allows you to drive really fast, knowing, really knowing, that you will be able to control your vehicle at a previously unthinkable speed.

▶ 2) You use the prior commands to "thread the needle", just missing the two defining cones for the chicane entrance (cones just above and below of the number "2"). Your reserve is the 4-6 inches you planned on missing each cone by. That's enough to catch the small twitches from flying into this section. If you try to leave too much distance to the cones, the worse line will force you to be slow. If you hit a cone, adjust your turn-in point or steering rate or brake release a little bit on the next run but don't give in and take a bad line.

♦ 3) Using the compressed suspension spring energy from the prior turn to the right you, wait, wait, Now!... flick the wheel quickly to the left. Coming into point 3 your reserve is the tons of unused

space to the right side of the car. This reserve will give you plenty of room to make the catches for traction twitches in this off-camber section. You can be confident that any micro-adjustments will have enough room to be made as you carry lots of speed, all while you are waiting for the turn-in point to arrive.



♦ 4) Again "thread the needle" (between the two cones just above and below the number 4). Your reserve is the tons of room on the exit of this turn (before the cone at point 5). This room allows you to adjust your line as needed to carry the speed out of the corner. ▶ 5) As you accelerate out of point 4, you apply as much power, as soon as possible. Your reserve is the rate at which you "roll" (not stomp) on the gas pedal. You don't want to take too much weight off of the front tires and "plow" (or "drift") too wide, but you do want to add as much gas as possible and still miss the cone at point "5". This was the perfect corner to practice the other AutoX-U driving skill for August 10th...

"Acceleration".

So arguably, the scariest turn on the August 10th course could in-fact be taken with "reserve" and still be wicked fast. For those who went to the Zone 1 Autocross, these same Focus and Acceleration skills, when used with reserve, were the perfect way to take the super-fast offset gates from the sweeping turn at the entrance to the second runway leg, all the way down to the optional slalom. Thank you Sir Moss for helping us better understand this aspect of fast driving and to help us fly!



The Porsche Type 540 (356) "Speedster", was introduced in late 1954.

Max Hoffman, the sole US importer of Porsches, advised the company that a lower-cost, somewhat spartan open-top version could sell well in the American market. With its low, raked windscreen, bucket seats and minimal folding top, the Speedster was an instant hit, especially in Southern California. Production of the Speedster peaked at 1,171 cars in 1957 and then started to decline. It was replaced in late 1958 by the "Convertible D" model that featured a taller, windshield, allowing improved headroom with the top up, roll-up glass side-windows and more comfortable seats.*

Today, Speedsters are highly sought after by collectors and enthusiasts worldwide. Seeing this many in on place is a very rare experience.

WINTER STORAGE TIPS FOR YOUR PORSCHE

TECH NOTES FROM SPENCER COX, Chief Instructor, CVR Drivers' Education

It may seem a little premature, but with our driving season half over, we thought we'd share our favorite tips for winter storage for your beloved Porsche.

Step One: Wash and wax. Washing your car before storing it will ensure that there are no harmful substances on the car that might cause rust or damage over time. For instance, if your Porsche has bird droppings or road salt on it, these can then damage the paint. Make sure to vacuum and clean the interior also.



Step Two: Fill the fuel tank. This helps prevent condensation inside the fuel tank. This is one of the most damaging things that often happens to stored automobiles. If storing for any extended length of time, it's mandatory to add fuel stabilizer ("Sta-Bil" or similar) to the gas tank. Be sure to add this to a full tank and to run the engine for fifteen minutes or so to thoroughly mix the fuel and stabilizing agent.

Step Three: Ideally, you'll store the car on jack stands. If this is impossible, inflate all four tires to the maximum pressure allowed by the tire manufacturer. This will help prevent flat spotting of the tires during storage.

CHALLENGE

Step Four: Make sure that your parking brake is disengaged. When your vehicle sits for an extended period of time with the parking brake on, the brake pads can rust to the rotor/drum causing the wheel to seize. Use a set of chocks to keep the car in place.

Step Five: While there's no sure-fire method of keeping rodents and other pests out of your car while it's being stored, small

measures such as putting a ball of aluminum foil in the exhaust pipe



and keeping all of the windows closed are obviously helpful. Use of jack stands will make the migration from floor to interior a bit more difficult. Dryer sheets, moth balls and other home remedies have very limited impact on nesting rodents. We recently found a mouse nest built into a dryer sheet!

Step Six: Use a good quality, breathable car cover to protect your Porsche from dust, etc.



Step Seven (SPRINGTIME!!): Make sure to change the motor oil/filter before you begin to use your Porsche again. This will remove any condensation and contaminants that have built up since the last time you drove your car.

For seasonal storage during the long winter here in the Northeast it may be prudent to also use a battery tender/maintainer. They are readily available and fairly inexpensive. Shown here is Porsche's Battery Maintainer, it is a simple and safe way to keep your your battery in shape and gives you the option of charging through your Porsche's cigarette lighter.



Tire Cradles when Jack Stands are not an option

When a vehicle sits for long periods the tires can flatspot. The reasons that tires flatspot are basically a function of pressure, temperature and time. Flatspotting can be temporary, with the tire rounding out with driving, or permanent, which effects the belting and casing of the tire.

One option that may be worth consideration is to use some type of device that helps keep them from developing flat spots. There are a number of products available, such as *Flatstoppers* or *TireCradles*. These products, in combination with increasing tire pressure to the tire manufacturers maximum recommended pressure should help keep your tires nice and round.

Of course, please don't forget to reduce your tire pressures back to normal before you take your car out in the spring.

New Special Exhibition at the Porsche Museum: "Project: Top Secret!"

Stuttgart/Atlanta—17/September 2014

From September 17, 2014 through January 11, 2015, the "Project: Top Secret!" special exhibition at the Porsche Museum in Stuttgart, Germany will showcase 16 unique vehicles, most of which have never been shown to the public.

The range of automobiles on display includes top-secret concept cars, camouflaged prototypes as well as one-of-a-kind recordbreaking, testing and experimental vehicles.

Development, research and meticulous attention to detail make up the verv core of Porsche's success. This is reflected in the company's

name: "Dr. Ing. h.c. F. Porsche AG." Currently. over 4.500 engineers work at the Porsche Development Center in Weissach, ensuring that Porsche always stays one step ahead of the competition. The path to new innovations is not always easy or straightforward. Many great ideas and concepts never make it to production due to

technical or economic reasons. However, they are often utilized in research projects or concept cars. Most of this happens behind closed doors - for good reason: great ideas are frequently copied by others. This is why many of the concept cars and experimental vehicles never leave the Weissach Development Center, After

projects are completed, these vehicles are usually scrapped. However, cars used in particularly vital or exciting projects were stored in the fleet of the Porsche Museum. As part of this special exhibition, they are now being revealed to the general public for the first time.

All 16 vehicles on display perfectly illustrate the spirit of the times or the corporate context of the respective decade. For example in 1973, Porsche addressed the prevailing energy crisis with the advanced "Forschungsprojekt Langzeit Auto", which means extended durability research vehicle – a car that was designed to operate reliably and efficiently for many decades thanks to state-ofthe-art engineering paired with the use of lightweight and environmentally-friendly materials. The world-record setting Porsche 924 and the Type 995 experimental passenger car are other projects from this era.

Seven exhibition cars date back to the 1980s, including a Porsche 959 aerodynamic prototype, a 928 Cabriolet as well as the Roadster Type 984 concept car that has never been shown before. The prototype of the Porsche 965 high-performance sports car, which was powered by a water-cooled V-8 mounted in the rear, is also being revealed for the very first time.

Cars from the 1990s include vehicles that never made it past the experimental stage such as the four-door Porsche 989 "family sports car," whose design turned out to set the course for future vehicle





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generations. The Type 986 A4 subframe ended up being just as unique. This prototype, based on a Porsche 911 Targa (Type 964), was used to test the mid-engine concept of the Boxster model series.

From the most recent past is a camouflaged prototype of the Porsche Panamera, which reveals a great deal of insight into the comprehensive testing of new models. Last but not least, current topics such as hybrid technology are featured in the "Project: Top Secret!" special exhibition. Visitors have the unique opportunity to view the "rolling chassis" of the 918 Spyder super sports car, serving as a technological showpiece for the future. A special program is offered on the following Sundays; 2:00 - 5:00 p.m.: Sept. 28, Oct. 19, Nov. 16, Dec. 14, Dec. 28, 2014, as well as on Jan. 4, 2015. In addition to the guided tour of the special exhibition, families can participate in a scavenger hunt, and camouflage a model 918 Spyder themselves. 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
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
