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

The four-cam powerplant in Ben and Rob Edwards' Type 540 Speedster is the photogenic subject of this months cover.



We have most of our dates for the season already picked out and now are just waiting for all of our venues to confirm with us in final contracts. I can tell you that at this time, we have just as many DE days planned for 2015 as we did for the 2014 season. Until the dates are confirmed. I. don't count my chickens. We've already had a couple of dates switched to different dates so until it's in writing, it's not official.

For the upcoming 2015 DE, we will not have our fall DE at WGI as all events from mid-August on will be cancelled due to WGI track repaving. So, for those of you who are thinking of going to WGI in 2015, we will only have our early summer spectacular WGI event and you must arrange your schedule so that you can attend. For those of you that love our fall WGI event, don't worry, we are going to add a two day event at the all new Palmer Motorsports facility in Palmer, MA, either in September or October. I hope to get final confirmation of all track days by mid-January and as soon as the contracts are signed, Susan will post all the dates on ClubRegistration.net so that you can start to make plans (vacation days, childcare, dog walker, hotel if necessary, etc.) for the 2015 DE season.



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RALLY — IT'S NOT JUST THE CARS, IT'S THE INSTRUCTIONS!

2015 should bring us at least two CVR rallies, one in the late spring and one in the fall. We have already started work on the spring rally, which will be held in the greater South Windsor and Ellington area in the northeastern part of the state (recall that our spring 2012 rally was held in northeast CT, so we return although not quite as far east as in 2012).

We are planning another "multifaceted" rally with several legs (sections between checkpoints) at least one of which will be rigged with traps, gimmicks and puzzles that will challenge your thinking and puzzle solving abilities to stay on course (while in your car, mostly, that is). We have a number of club members who have joined the rally team that will be adding their rally-wisdom to the rally crafting we are embarking on, so plan on something interesting and definitely out of the box for this next event. To be a bit more specific, the gimmicked leg (or two) on this rally will tax your ability to read and interpret signs, which by the way may be valid only if they meet all sorts of requirements – like being on the correct side of the road; being before or after an intersection or intervening roadway; existing only on certain types of roads; having the appropriate support; RIP (read in part) or RIF (read in full); quoted in full or in part; having narrow or unusual meanings only as defined in the rally instructions... to name just a few of what could be in our sign rules and regulations!

(Is a sign with a misspelling on it valid if the misspelling is not part of what is quoted? Does a sign on a dead-end road exist? How about one on a private road, or one on a moveable structure?) You WILL have to read the general instructions dealing with signs to survive the gimmicked leg of this rally.

As the planning and scheduling meeting for CVR activities in 2015 hasn't taken place at the time of this writing, the exact date for the Spring 2015 rally is not yet set, but it will most likely by a Sunday morning and early afternoon in late May or early June.

As noted in last month's *Challenge*, if we can get at least 5 checkpoints staffed, we will most likely make this a poker run in addition to the course-following part of the rally. You will remember that a poker run is set up so that you draw a playing card at each check

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point, and make a poker hand at the finish with those cards with the best hand(s) winning. One or two of the poker run's sections will be gimmicked such that you have to follow the general, special, route and supplemental instructions to stay on course. The way we can tell which teams were on course and which ones weren't is by having each rally team record the course markers that they see along the route that they travel. Those on the correct route will see course markers that are worth plus points, and those who travel the incorrect route will see course markers worth minus points. (Unfortunately, you won't know if the course markers you see are good or bad until the rally is over... but if you are interpreting the instructions carefully, they should all be good!)

As the planning and scheduling meeting for CVR activities in 2015 hasn't taken place at the time of this writing, the exact date for the Spring 2015 rally is not yet set, but it will most likely by a Sunday morning and early afternoon in late May or early June. We should know this date by the deadline for the March *Challenge*. Suggestions for a starting and/or finishing location in the greater South Windsor area will be happily received and checked out – we need a place for about 40 people and 20 to 25 Porsches. 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HOFFMAN CUP... THE ULTIMATE "TEST DRIVE"!

Let's face facts. You, holding this Challenge article in your hands right now, are a special breed of enthusiast. You are a "cut above" the average enthusiast and far far beyond the roadcholesterol masses. So as a top-tier Porsche affectianado, you might be a little iaded when it comes to "the best". "Base" cars, even from our beloved manufacturer Porsche, don't really hit your radar as you play with the on-line Porsche Configurator. After all, how good could a "base" Boxster, with a PDK for heaven's sake, possibly be? To answer that question, you had to be at the October 19th AutoX event and you had to have earned a Top-20 points position for the season. Then you could answer the question yourself, since each got to take a brand new 2014 Boxster on a real "test drive", courtesy of the uber enthusiasts at Hoffman Porsche

Before the "test drive" could get started, there was one more 2014 CVR AutoX to be run. Although the year-long championship points had already been decided at the prior event, this AutoX



had a focus like none other. Everyone wanted to do well of course, but their real goal was to use the four heats before lunch as practice for the afternoon. Sweeping turns and "momentum" were the key and shaving the cones as close as

possible. The course was carefully crafted to be a "final exam" for all 14 of the *AutoX-University* driving skills taught throughout the season.

The AutoX Class of 2014 proved that they have been paying attention all year. They didn't need a grading-curve to boost the class average on this exam. Demonstration of great driving skills was found in each of the different categories and it was clear that this event had a completely different vibe to it, "cramming" for the real exam to take place after lunch. Cones were readily sacrificed to be sure not an inch was left unused and that grip on the cool asphalt was fully explored. Everyone was paying extra attention whenever any Boxster or Cayman came to the line. Maybe we could get some insight into their secrets? Maybe we could learn how to coax the timing system into surrendering a few tenths of a second when it would be our turn?

As the morning event ended it was clear that the mid-engine crowd made their presence known. Eight of the fourteen classes were won by a mid-engine car! Notable congratulations go to David Jeffway, winning "Improved 2" and ending up a mere 0.1 second away from FTD! Congratulations also go to Tim Anderson, who burst onto the radar just

this last summer by winning "Novice" class in his first outing, and now drove his own 2014 Boxster to win "Stock 3" class, heretofore known as "Brian's class" since Brian Fournier has won it in every AutoX since June 2012! With the fast pace and extra focus, by noon time it felt like a full day already, but the day was just about to get a whole lot better!



back-to-back runs. Sully and Corey from team Hoffman gave us insights on how to get the most out of the brand new 2014 Boxster! Lots of discussion about whether to use the paddle shifters or keep it in automatic. The hot thinking was to let the Porsche Engineers prove their worth by letting the car do the thinking. Having this kind of opportunity to drive a new Porsche "in anger" is truly special. This is why we drive a Porsche in the first place! One through twenty, we each took one familiarization lap. As each drove, the others were watching and listening... straining for any knowledge that would

help them find even a minute parcel of time somewhere, anywhere, when it was their turn behind the wheel. The event was simultaneously humbling and exhilarating. It was also wicked-good fun, being given permission to drive a Porsche flat-out! As each driver finished their first run the answer to everyone's question became obvious. How good could a brand new "base" 2014 Boxster really be? One word was uttered by each of us..."WOW! The car was amazing and would do everything we asked of it. No excuses would be generated from the car, so we all had to totally focus on our driving!

Each driver now had two remaining opportunities, back-to-back, to set their best time. Everyone ooohed and aaahed as each of the runs progressed and heartbreaking pylons were sacrificed. Lap after lap the drama built. The lead swapped again and again. Each driver took a deep breath, then charged off to battle the clock and the cones. The remaining drivers commiserated and gave each other their observations of what worked best. As each driver finished their final run the cruel clock, or mean pylons gave them plenty to contemplate. Each of us felt that we could have done a little better. That's what the winter, and "next year" is for! The Hoffman Cup was an amazing event

that has now set the benchmark for all of CVR, Zone1, and even PCA!

The 2014 Boxster was truly amazing! It did everything perfectly! Many of us suddenly realized that driving our beloved Stuttgart weapons of old was now just a futile attempt to hold off the obvious march of progress. This "base" Boxster makes everyone look good, and if you utilize some of the *AutoX-U* driving skills to its controls, it makes you look remarkable! Yes, even in 'base' trim, the Boxster is a Weisach wonder-car! It has world class feel and finesse, and provides ridiculous speed. I've lost respect for those journalist that had bashed the "electric assisted" steering feel, as they

were either looking for controversy where there is none, or worse, they are ham-fisted posers that can't actually feel the beautiful precision engineered into the car. It truly was amazing. Wow, wow, wow!

As for the PDK, we listened to Sully, Corey, and Fred and kept it in full automatic... and it was perfect! It held the gear on deceleration as we wished to get the weight transfer to the front going into corners, and it maximized acceleration based on throttle position. As a die-hard shifting fanatic. I have to admit that this has gone a very long way into making me a PDK convert. I'd miss the utter joy of a perfectly executed double-clutch heel-and-toe downshift while cruising around on the street for sure, but for any form of competition it's a "no brainer" that no human can beat a PDK's performance, or make up the time.

The only aspect of the car that I'd like to further explore would be to turn off the stability control. While the allowances to rotate the car were amazingly high before you provoked Helga (the e-nanny) to intervene, I think there was more time to be gained with her sleeping. We did however decide that keeping her on

stand-by would be best, so we made that the one rule. Once you got calibrated to where Helga would scold you (as I did on my second run) it was just a matter of being smoother at that spot the next run, (which I also did).

Overall, this "test drive" made us all realize just how crazy good even a base Boxster really is. If all of that wasn't endorsement enough, consider that the top 5 finishers in the Hoffman Cup all beat the morning's FTD time! The winning time in the Boxster, a "base" Boxster, was a full second faster than the winning time from the morning AutoX in a hormone injected 911! Just amazing!

The inaugural Hoffman Cup was truly a magical event. We witnessed some great driving and we all grew as drivers because of it. We also grew in friendship for our fellow CVR teammates and in admiration for the team at Hoffman Porsche as they demonstrated they really "get it". Its tough being a special breed of enthusiast, but it's a great feeling that there is an equally special Porsche dealership that understands us. CVR gives a sincere thank you to Hoffman Porsche for being that dealership.

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

Porsche Cars North America Reports New Record Sales Month

U.S. Porsche dealers sell 4,699 vehicles in November 2014

Atlanta — 2/December 2014

Porsche Cars North America, Inc. (PCNA), importer and distributor in the United States of the Porsche 918 Spyder, 911, Boxster, and Cayman sports cars, Macan and Cayenne SUVs, and the Panamera four-door sports sedan line-up, today announced November 2014 sales of 4,699 vehicles.

For the year, PCNA has delivered 43,732 vehicles in the U.S., an increase of 11.9 percent over the same time period in 2013 (39,077).

"This sets a new record for sales in a month for PCNA, outpacing the previous record of 4,609 vehicles, which was reached in May of this year," Joe Lawrence, Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer, commented on November sales.

November marks the first month the comprehensively revised 2015 Cayenne models were available, reflected in 1,619 Cayenne vehicle deliveries. There were 925 deliveries of 911 sports cars. The Macan had another strong month with November sales of 987 units, while demand continues to exceed availability. Boxster and Cayman sales yielded 656 combined deliveries. It was proudly

announced at the Los Angeles Auto Show that the order books for the 918 Spyder have been closed. As expected, the leading market for orders is the United States.

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TECH TIPS

MAKING THE CASE FOR WINTER TIRES FOR YOUR PORSCHE

If you are going to drive it in the winter, there is good reason to use a tire purpose-built for grip on ice, snow... AND cold pavement.

WINTER TIRE COMPOUNDS ARE OPTIMIZED FOR GRIP ON COLD, WET ROADS. The trade-off of course is that they are less grippy when it's warm. You don't need to take them off immediately when the snow stops, just switch back in the spring.

THE FLEXIBLE GROOVES that are molded into the tires tread are called sipes. They increase traction by increasing the number of edges that grip.

WHEN BUYING WINTER TIRES consider a narrower tire with taller sidewall. Narrower tires tend to penetrate snow better. A smaller wheel size sometimes helps, but it needs to be large enough to clear your brake calipers.

WINTER TIRES WILL LAST AT LEAST SEVERAL SEASONS if they are not abused. Using winter tires also conserves your expensive summer tires because you won't be using them in the winter.

WITH A SET OF GOOD WINTER TIRES even your rear drive Porsche will handle snow better. Ground clearance and snow depth tend to be limiting factors, even with an all-wheel drive car. Remember, more drive wheels will help you get moving, but they won't help you turn... or slow down

WINTER TIRES ARE GENERALLY LESS EXPENSIVE than your high performance summer tires, but they are not cheap, and the initial expenditure can be painful. But think of the money you'll save on bent wheels, damaged sheet metal, and towing service to get you out of that ditch


