The CVR 2014 Winter Workshop — cool cars and a trailer on display outside, shirts for all registered participants, raffle prizes, informative speakers, food (sponsored by Danbury Porsche) and lots of fun — shared among a great group of people.

We started the morning off with registration and a variety of breakfast foods for everyone to pick on, from the healthy fruit and yogurt selection to the somewhat healthy granola bars to the sugary donuts and muffins, along with coffee and juice. Danbury Porsche was once again the sponsor of the food at our Workshop, continuing what they did in 2013.

Our main focus of the Winter Workshop was car safety equipment from driver helmets, HANS devices and

roll bars to gloves and shoes. Stable Energies brought a big array of display items. Bob, Laurette and Joe were on hand all morning to talk with everyone about their individual needs. When it came time for their presentation, they started by showing us how the HANS is meant to be worn and how it works in an incident. It is really a very simple design but with really big results, when needed. We moved from driver apparel into how necessary in-car safety equipment is for all track day participants and especially for advanced drivers. The "gang" from Stable Energies had a full set-up of a complete bolt-in roll bar safety system to show

how it would protect a driver and passenger, in the rare case of a bad day at the track. The sharp looking roll bar was powder coated black, and was set up with a set of Schroth HANS Enduro harnesses, the latest new Halo seat from OMG and a fire extinguisher. Mike Keller, our new Concours Chair, volunteered to help them demonstrate how the driver's safety equipment ---helmet/HANS /roll bar/harnesses - all work together when properly installed to ensure safe results when needed Bob told us that they have a bolt-in roll bar for most any Porsche and all are non-intrusive to the car's interior. In fact, aftermarket seats and a nicely done roll bar look great.

We were fortunate to have several cars on display outside, from a street stock 991 to a safety equipped Cayman to a total race-prepped Cayman. Thanks to Danbury Porsche for displaying the brand new white 991 C2 PDK and to

Spencer Cox (Speedsport Tuning) for bringing a 2012 Cayman R with all the track day bolt-on goodies installed a perfect example of a street car that can be used at the track with great safety equipment in it, that can all be removed and put back to stock with a dav's worth of work. The Speedsport Cayman showed how we can take our daily driver and add all of the necessary safety equipment without compromising the beauty or future resale of the car Also thanks to Musante Motorsports for bringing a beautiful fully-prepared track Cayman. The car had a fully welded roll cage with a hot rod engine — this was not a street car/daily driver but was a perfect example for showing what kind of safety equipment can be added to a car.



By the time you read this, we will have done a limited "in the room" version of the poker run, complete with modified scoresheets at the April 19th new member sampler. Accompanying this column is a word puzzle that was introduced at the sampler and will actually be used in the spring rally! So

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



Don't dismiss seemingly basic driving skills. They can be a lot trickier than you may think. Most driving enthusiasts have to unlearn years of bad habits and reinvent their approach to "basic" skills in order to ultimately master them. Modern electronic "driver aides" are designed to hide our "little flaws", often without much of a hint that we would have just crashed without their silent help. Or worse, we might have to admit that we are the weak link! AutoX-U was founded on the premise that we can all drive better no matter how much experience and enthusiasm we have. With focused instruction, the perfect course to work on the 14 go-fast driving skills, and most importantly, with receiving real-time feedback, we can all speed-learn the right techniques and have fun doing it.

The May 18th *AutoX-U* course is designed specifically to improve everyone's Steering and Braking skills. There is nothing "basic" about these advanced skills when they are done right.

**STEERING (AutoX-U Skill #3)** The April *Challenge* covered: straightening out the corner; cutting down distance; and throttle steering. Now let's make sure one of the most important aspects of steering is not overlooked. How you actually turn the wheel.

**Shuffle steering rules!** It's the technique to use when you have to turn the wheel for sharp turns, and when you need to quickly turn the steering wheel more than 900. For example, navigating a right-angle turn requires about <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> to <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of a steering wheel revolution, and a hairpin turn about a full revolution. This is the perfect time to shuffle steer. Keeping a death grip on the 9:00 and 3:00 positions will turn your forearms into a pretzel in these tight turns, which isn't pretty and it isn't fast. You can see from



the photo that you will lose the ability to turn the wheel even a little bit more if needed, and you will have lost the >>>continued on page 40 leverage and feel to make quick corrections. Fortunately, shuffle steering fixes all of those issues.

Do you drive with "Pretzel Arms"? Try turning the wheel a ½ turn to the right without letting go of the original grip and this is how you look. Not very much feel or ability to move the wheel quickly. There is a better way...

Train yourself to use shuffle steering on the street until it becomes habit. First move your seat forward so that your elbows are bent 90° while your hands

Ready for action! 90° elbows, hands lightly gripping the wheel with fingertip feel, each hand staying in its ideal control zone.

are resting lightly on the wheel at 9:00 and 3:00. This position gives you the maximum leverage for quick steering input, and it allows a light touch through your finger-tips. Shuffle steering is when you only allow your right hand to reside between the 12:00 and 4:00 position at all

Ahhh...that's better! Here is the same turning angle as the pretzel arm photo, but now with the help of one shuffle steering pass-off. Now you will have excellent feel and can quickly react to balance the car on the edge!

times, and your left hand between 12:00 and 8:00 at all times. When you make a turn requiring more than 90° of steering input, pass-off or "shuffle"







the wheel from one hand to the next at the 12:00 position.

Practice shuffle steering at low speeds, like when you turn into your driveway or into parking spot. You will typically need 2-3 shuffles (of 90° each) to turn-in and then immediately 2-3 shuffles back to straighten the wheel. It will likely seem awkward and busy at first until your hands get used to it, but don't give up. As you progress your hands will become faster and smoother in the pass-off. You will also start to relax your grip and achieve a lighter touch, using more finger-tips than palms. Now advance to medium speed turns to practice this skill, such as after you pull away from an empty stop-sign turn.

It will likely seem awkward and busy at first until your hands get used to it, but don't give up. As you progress your hands will become faster and smoother in the pass-off. You will also start to relax your grip and achieve a lighter touch, using more finger-tips than palms.

Finally, come to the May 18th AutoX for the perfect place to try this out at high speed. Turns 6, 7, 8, and 13 are specifically designed to use shuffle steering. These turns will allow you to finally appreciate the real beauty of this advanced driving skill, and will make you glad you practiced before the event. Your hands never get crossed-up, you have maximum leverage to turn the wheel quickly going into and out of each of these turns, and when the steering "gets light" (because the tire is starting to slide) your light grip allows that all-important finger-tip feel needed for cornering on the edge. This is exactly where you want to be!

#### BRAKING (AutoX-U Skill #11)

To go fast you need to use the brakes! "Throwing" a car sideways into a corner without braking and using the sideways sliding to scrub-off speed is akin to "drifting". It looks spectacular, but is painfully slow and an inefficient way to reduce speed. The clock doesn't lie. Think of it this way... braking in a straight line at the threshold of locking up the tires (which is exactly what ABS does) is way more efficient than sliding the tires.

Until you are calibrated on how strong the brakes of a Porsche really are, it's common to only use half of the braking power and yet feel amazed. Keep pressing! Press harder and harder until the tires actually start to lock up. or activate the ABS Done to this level braking should be a smoothly violent experience! The AutoX course for May 18th has several great spots designed to let you practice and calibrate this feeling. Specifically Turns 6, 7, 8, 9, and 13. Try turning off the ABS and exploring this threshold on your own. You will become a much better driver that wav!

Does your car understeer on these kind of tight turns? Of course it does! Virtually every road car understeers on relatively tight corners, including 911s! That's where good braking skills come to the rescue. Practice braking later and

later so that the nose of your car is achieves maximum weight transfer to the front tires and you feel maximum break-pedal pressure right at the turn-in point for the corner. Then at the moment you start turning the steering wheel, gently start reducing the brake pressure from maximum to zero by the end of the first 1/3 of the turn (trail braking). Now here is the hard part... DON'T ADD ANY GAS YET throughout the middle 1/3 of the turn. Just maintain the same speed.

(hopefully at the cornering O NAME OF threshold where the tires are just slightly complaining). Finally in the last 1/3 of the turn, as you start to straighten out the steering wheel progressively roll on the gas so you are at SCHE Driving to the Edge full gas only when you pointed straight ahead. Do this smoothly and you will have erased the understeer... and will be really quick.

Higher speed turns on the other hand, like turns 3, 4, 5, and 9, 10, 11, 12, require the opposite form of braking. These require a very delicate application of the brakes so as not to upset the car while in mid-corner (which would likely cause a spin, or at least some drama). You may find that just backing of the gas pedal a little bit provides sufficient "braking" to keep vou in control. Re-read last month's Challenge about weight transfer and throttle steering for these corners.

Most of us tend to overuse the brakes when driving in a spirited fashion, especially when the adrenaline

CHALLENGE

of an AutoX or DE event is freely flowing. This is a good tendency compared to some that never want to brake! You will likely find yourself braking too soon before the actual turn-in point of a corner, so when you actually start turning the steering wheel the poor front tires have already lost any beneficial weight transferred to them. This is a sure way to cause time adding understeer. Realizing that you braked too much vou will get the urge to make matters worse by wanting to add

of AME

gas way too soon at the beginning of the turn. This immediately takes more weight off of the front wheels and results in even more understeer. Doing this will easily add one, two, or three seconds of time for each corner taken this way. The good news is now you know how to correct

this, and you can use Turn 7 as the perfect place to practice your new braking skills and be thrilled at how the timing clock rewards their application. Indeed, indeed: there is nothing "basic" about these advanced skills See you on May 18th.

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#### History of the Kensico Dam

The Kensico dam was completed in 1917 It stands 307 feet above the lowest point of the foundation and is 1.843 feet long. Granite, the rock used for the concrete and decorative stones on the surface of the dam. was excavated from a quarry at nearby Cranberry Lake Preserve and brought to the site by rail. Construction of the dam also required an electric plant, sand pit, and stone crushing plant, as well as new housing and schools for workers and their families More than 1,500 people, most of them Italian, worked on this project. Many of the construction families settled in the area after completion of the dam. contributing to the growth and character of Valhalla and surrounding communities.

The Rising, Westchester county's September 11th Memorial, is located at the intersection of many pathways and viewpoints, and thereby extends its presence into the surrounding landscape. "The Rising" is an open structure, can be approached from all directions and allows people of all ages and abilities to view it as well as move through it. 🕲

For our newer members who may not have seen this in the past, following is an informative piece that ran in *Challenge* several years ago. With the Annual Summer Concours coming up you may find some of these tips helpful to get you started.

## A FIRST TIMERS GUIDE TO PREPARING FOR A CONCOURS By Bey Gould

Concours Ready Because the Annual CVR Summer Concours will be here before you know it...

Have you thought about entering your car in a Concours? That is great news and I want to give you a few hints on how to prepare for entering your first Concours.

In Northern and Southern California, the two PCA Zones run a series for Concours competition. I am not sure how other parts of the country run their Concours. However what I am going to talk about is pretty universal as far as prepping your car for the first time. I am going to give you the simple approach to get you started.

After you have prepped your car and entered it for the first time, you'll want to know more about what product we recommend, this can be a long list as products change and just about everyone has an opinion.

First look at the car classifications that are offered for the event you are interested in entering. I would choose the entry level class, like Wash & Shine. In Wash & Shine, only the exterior and interior are judged. It is easier than having to clean the trunk and engine as well, this could be a bit overwhelming if you are just getting started.

For the exterior, wash the car thoroughly. This includes the wheels, bumpers, paint, windows, headlights, tires, fog lights & valance. Make sure you do not leave any water spots. To reduce water spotting, use distilled water for washing and rinsing, if you do not have distilled water around; make sure you wash the car in segments. This way you can dry it off quickly to reduce spotting. brush or air to whisk the dust away.

On your wheels, make sure they are cleaned and polished. Clean off the sidewalls, using Simple Green or some other cleaner to remove any excess tire dressing or grime. Use a soft bristled brush to scrub the tires with cleaner. You will want presentation of the car look better.

Now that you are done with the exterior, it looks pretty darn good huh? Take a few photos, it is fun to chronicle your efforts and share them with your friends.

The next area to clean for a Wash & Shine Class is the Interior. You are

You also want to polish the car. If your Porsche sits out all the time, then you will want to wax it, if not – a good polish will make your car sparkle. Make sure vou get the entire wax/polish residue off the paint, rubber and crevices. You can use a soft bristled brush or tooth brush to remove the excess wax or polish stuck on the rubber or crevice. It will break loose and create a fine dust. Don't wipe this stuff down with a rag; it will just move it somewhere else. You are better off using a very soft bristled

to be able to rub your finders across the sidewalls without your finders turning black or brown. On the wheels themselves, polish them, clean around the lug nuts. as this is an area judges particularly love to check. Then make sure you don't have any excess polish along the rim or lug nut area. Don't put a dressing on the wheels. this stuff just picks up more dirt from the road. You don't have to clean the wheel wells for a Concours, but it is a good idea to do so, as it makes the overall

going to clean just about everything that is visible and then some. I will try to point you through the basics to get you through your first Concours, but this area does require attention to detail. First clean the windows, why first, well you will have to climb in the car to clean them. When you do this vou also bring in with you dirt and debris from the outside or your shoes. I'll be honest. I hate cleaning the windows, finding a good streak free cleaner is a lot of trial and error. I have found that a

solution of Distilled water and rubbing alcohol works best with a micro fiber towel.

Now that the windows are done, the next to clean is the upholstery. If you have leather seats, get a good leather cleaner and conditioner. I have used a few of them, but recently have been using Connoly's Hide Care. The important thing with Leather interior is to keep the leather conditioned. so it does not dry out and crack. If your upholstery has seams, make sure vou clean these as well. Dirt and dust collects in the crevices. Use a soft bristled brush or toothbrush to clean these out. Clean the seat belt

handles, if these are chrome, chrome cleaners like Wenol or Mothers will polish them up. Next area is the dash, instruments, glove box and steering column. Make sure these are all clean of dust and dirt. If the dash is leather. it is important to condition this as well. Make sure vou clean the vents and defroster vents. Take an old soft cotton sock and use it like a glove, it works great to pick up loose dust and dirt. Sprav a bit of water on the glove to make it slightly damp, and it will pick up the dust and dirt without depositing it somewhere else in the interior. One area many people forget about cleaning is under

the dash – I know you are saying WHAT, under the dash. But think about it. it gets just as dirty and dusty under there as anywhere else on the car. The stuff over time can build up and is just yucky. It also can get on the carpet or affect those with allergies if not removed. Use the sock method I mentioned before and it will clean it up - judges love to look in this area. Another favorite spot for the judges (mine too) is the door latches, these get really dirty over time, you can clean these with WD40 and they turn out great. I do not lubricate mine except with WD40, but if you want to lubricate the latches, make

sure the lubricant is clean. When this lubricant gets dirty it becomes abrasive. Don't forget to clean the console or door pockets, if you have them, they should be dust/dirt free and empty when you show the car.

Now we move onto the carpets and flooring. First, a good vacuuming is required. This includes along the edges of the carpet, under the mats if removable, etc. Use a crevice tool to get those narrow or hard to reach areas. If your carpet is spotted with dirt, you should shampoo this out if possible. Don't get the carpet too wet when shampooing and allow it to dry before the show.

The day of the show, bring sunscreen, hat, sunglasses, beverages, chair and a mat. You will also want to bring some of your cleaning supplies and tools to do touch up work once you are at the show.

These are the basics; we can go into a lot more



detail on how to prep an automobile for a Concours. If you take your car to a detailer first, you will still want to go through some of the steps detailed above.

I have been showing my 1970 911E for the last 15 years +. My car had been raced, toured and rallied for years, so I know how tough it can seem to get started. But I have enjoyed seeing how the car has improved over the years and it is an award-winning automobile. Once you get it clean, it is not that difficult to keep it clean.

Here is little checklist for both the exterior and interior to get you started – Good Luck



Sir Stirling Craufurd Moss, OBE (born 17 September 1929), raced from 1948 to 1962, winning 212 of the 529 races he entered, including 16 Formula One Grands Prix. He would compete in as many as 62 races in a single year and drove 84 different makes of car over the course of his racing



career, including Cooper 500, ERA, Lotus, Maserati, Mercedes-Benz, Porsche and Vanwall single-seaters, Aston Martin, Ferrari, Jaguar and Mercedes-Benz sports cars, and Jaguar saloons. Like many drivers of the era, he competed in several formulae, often on the same day. He remained the English driver with the most Formula One victories until 1991 when Nigel Mansell overtook him after competing in more races.

This year's Concours will also be a very special one for Porsche fans, as 2014 just happens to be the 60th Anniversary of the introduction of the 356 Speedster and we are expeciting a number of Speedsters in attendance!

Porsche is celebrating the world premiere of the Boxster GTS and Cayman GTS at Auto China in Beijing. A unique level of performance is required to wear the GTS badge, thus the duo feature more powerful engines and additional standard equipment. Porsche is

presenting the two new models for the first time at its press conference on April 20, 11:30 a.m. local time (April 19, 11:30 p.m. EST) in Hall E5, booth 05.

The Boxster GTS and Cayman GTS mid-mounted 3.4-liter 6-cylinder boxer engine delivers an additional 15 hp compared to their "S" model counterparts. This means the Boxster GTS has 330 hp and the Cayman GTS has 340 hp. Torque has been increased by 7 lb.-ft. in each model: 273 lb.-ft. in the Boxster GTS and 280 lb.-ft. in the Cayman GTS. With the standard Sport Chrono package, optional PDK transmission and Sport Plus button activated, the Boxster GTS reaches 60 mph from a standstill in 4.4 seconds (4.7 seconds with manual transmission) and 4.3 seconds (4.6 seconds with manual transmission) in the Cayman GTS. The top track speed for the Boxster GTS is 174 mph (173 with PDK) and 177 mph (175 with PDK) for a Cayman GTS.

The Boxster GTS is priced from \$73,500 and the Cayman GTS is priced from \$75,200, excluding destination charges of \$995.




Both models will be available for delivery in the U.S. this summer.

Alongside the new GTS sports cars, the 919 Hybrid and the 911 RSR racecars, and the 918 Spyder will also make their Chinese market debut in Beijing. This extraordinary lineup at Auto China reflects the rapidly growing interest in Porsche vehicles. China is the second largest single market for Porsche after the U.S.A. In 2013, Porsche boosted sales in China by 19.9 percent to a total of 37,425 vehicles. While sales in the U.S. increased by 20.3 percent to a total of 42,323 vehicles. 🍪
