RALLY — IT'S NOT JUST THE CARS, IT'S THE INSTRUCTIONS!

As this is being written, it is just a few days before the June 9th rally, and according to the weather channel, the day's weather will be dry sandwiched between a rainy Saturday and a rainy Monday. Good karma, me thinks for this day of rally teams attempting to stay on course (as everyone knows, bad weather makes it more difficult to read signs and interpret instructions).

See the August *Challenge* for a full write up on the June rally. In the interim, please save the date for our second "coursemarker" rally scheduled for October 27th, probably with a falloweenie theme, in the Durham, Guilford and Madison area – another very beautiful part of Connecticut. And for those of you who still don't know what a coursemarker rally is, here is the definition of a coursemarker from the General Instructions written for the June rally.

"Coursemarker (CM) — These are approximately 9x5 inch wooden plaques with the CVR logo shape and a letter and a number on them that will be placed along the rally route. CMs will be mounted so that they are facing you or are parallel to your direction of travel. They will not be placed so that you have to look behind you to see them. If you see a CM on the back side of a pole or object facing away from you ignore it. Wait until you're

traveling the opposite direction and you see it facing you, then consider recording it on your rally scoresheet. An example of a CM will be available at the start of the rally. CM's will be placed above the ground on stakes, utility poles, trees or on sign supports. They will generally be encountered no more than two tenths of a mile after discovering or executing a gimmick or avoiding a trap. When you see a valid coursemarker (usually after you have figured out a gimmick or trap), you should record the number and letter on your rally scoresheet. Then look on the Supp/SI sheet to see if there are any instructions corresponding to that letter and number. If the instruction exists and it is an SI (special instruction), then simply do it. If it is a Supp (supplemental instruction), and you've determined that the Supp is valid, then perform the instruction carefully to get you back on course."

We will need another team of "locals" to help put on the October rally. Please volunteer via email at rally@cvrpca.org.

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- 2. Gently rub Freedom Waterless Car Wash onto the surface with that first towel. You want to always use the "wet on wet" method. Wet towel with a wet surface. This way there is nothing dry touching anything else dry.

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

FINALLY... THE FIRST COFFEE RUN OF THE SEASON — TO KENT FALLS STATE PARK


After two postponements, on a beautiful June 1st sunny, summer day of 85+degrees (finally) we had our 1st CVR Coffee Run of the season.

There were 37 Porsches at the start in Stamford, CT, due in part to posts on Pelican and Rennlist 911 forums that brought a few cars from Westchester, Brooklyn and one or two from New Jersey.

There where four Porsches in the parking lot when I got there at 8:05am, all parked in the shade of one of the only two trees in the parking area. I parked in the shade under the second tree, and as more and more Porsches arrived, people signed the waiver, took directions and chit chatted about the run. Then it was time for the oooos and ahhhhs of checking out all the Porsches. We had a short drivers' meeting at 8:45am. I went over the route and offered Phil Capella's advice that "no one has ever won a coffee run", to which we got a few laughs. After reminding everyone to drive

with caution, we got on the road by 9:01am. Earlier that morning I spotted a Stamford Police Officer getting coffee at Starbucks (like we've never seen that before), I asked if he was around at 9:00am if he could get us out of the parking lot in one group and he said "no problem". He did just that by blocking the two northbound lanes, lights flashing and

holding traffic. It took about 45-50 minutes to the first stop in Norwalk, CT at a McDonalds on Main St. 27 Porsches made this 1st leg of the trip but 10 were never heard from again...lol. We hung around for about 45 minutes (hoping that a few lost souls might find their way) then headed back out on the road again, driving through some of NY and CT's



beautiful backroads. We passed Squantz Pond, Candlewood Lake, Ball Pond, numerous rivers and lakes on Rt 53, Rt 39, and Rt 7, just to name a few. ANNER every time

happens when you reach your race day objectives. When I was 55 years old, I raced in the first Porsche race at Lime Rock. My car's picture was on the cover of Porsche *Panorama* magazine on the pole position alongside Nick Ventura in the "Batmobile". After a spin on the final lap at Big Bend, I came in third overall behind Dick Howe's 924 GTR and the "Batmobile".

When I was 60 years old, we raced at Road Atlanta against five other 3-liter Porsche vintage IMSA GTU cars. At the start of the race, it was raining and Alex Job asked me why I was not running on rain tires. I told him I never raced in the rain

before and I didn't have rain tires. Then, sitting there in all my pride, I stated, "I come from where you dance with the gal you brung, and my gal's name is 'Slicks'." As it turned out, when the rain lessened, I found the dry line and won first overall.

When I was 65, we raced at Road Atlanta again with similar Porsche vintage IMSA GTU cars, and Joe Coghill's ROCK96 944 GTR car. We put on brand new Goodyear slicks and ran consistent 1 min. 25 sec. laps for one hour. We came



in second overall behind a 935 Turbo. As it turned out, the following week IMSA had their Pro race, and with new GTU-class cars, they were only 1.5 seconds faster! You have heard NASCAR drivers state that that their car is not handling and they need to change tires. Well, it looks like I got that one-in-a-lifetime perfect set.

When I was 70, we raced at Sebring and my car was off three seconds from the previous year. We worked with Joe Stimola from Penske Shocks. He kept saying "if you are going to make a change, make a big change and then bring it back." He also said, "Everybody's off three seconds this year." And we said, "No, we're off three seconds." And after three days, we found 31/2 seconds and placed second.

This year, I was 75 at the Lime Rock Twin Sprint Rumble Porsche Club Race April 26-27, 2013. My car was the slowest car in its class the first day. My fastest time at Lime Rock is 56 seconds - in last year's race. To improve the car, my Crew Chief, Greig Johnson, along with the expert guidance of Peter Dawe, worked on tire temperature and pressure, shock adjustments, wing adjustment, corner weight adjustments and, incidentally, we had to add 200 pounds to qualify for Class GT4R. Our fastest qualifying time was 55.5, nearly one second quicker than the previous year. Some would say it came from the wisdom I gained over the past 75 years. My team and I think it came from setting a realistic, enjoyable goal to break into the 55-second mark in a 1973 air-cooled vintage 911 Porsche. We came in second in class and the last overall, down three laps.

Some may also remember this race because after having to return to the pits to repair the throttle linkage, I returned to the race, waited for the leading field to catch up and then resumed our race. No one on my team cared that we were down three laps. All four cars in the lead raced hard, fair and excitingly. We came home a winner.



Not many of us know that Lime Rock Park could have had two circuits, the 1.53 mile short circuit we all know and love, and a longer 3.00 mile "mountain circuit" which would have used the hill east of the track.

They had even bulldozed the trees for the mountain circuit, but it never was built. Looking at the attached old maps, you can still find the "mountain circuit" if you were to take a hike onto the hill east of the track. The circuit would

have included a much longer front straight past the turn in for Big Bend, going up into the hill, with four additional turns including a hairpin, and exiting onto the short chute between Big Bend and the Left Hander.

The course was originally laid out by Jim Vaill in 1955, the owner of the land who operated a gravel pit and cornfield on the site. Using an aerial photograph as a guide, Jim bulldozed the present 1.53 mile circuit, hoping to

do the mountain circuit after famed industrial designer Raymond Loewy head-designed the futuristic pedestrian bridges, paddocks and pits. However, there was no budget for any of this and the mountain circuit was never built.

Porsche celebrates 50 years of the 911 with exclusive limited edition model

Stuttgart - 4/June 2013

The Porsche 911 resolves apparent contradictions like no other sports car – such as between tradition and innovation or between exclusivity and high social acceptance, and of course between performance and efficiency. And so, Porsche is celebrating the 50th anniversary of the 911 at the International Motor Show (IAA) in Frankfurt with a special anniversary

model based on the 911 Carrera S: like the original 911. the 911 50th Anniversary Edition is a coupé with a flat-six rear engine and rear wheel drive. Its efficient performance, active sport suspension - and special body have current relevancy: the anniversary 911 features the wide body, which is typically reserved for the all-wheel drive Carrera 4 models. This special edition will be limited to 1963 cars. a number that represents the year of the 911 world premiere.

Porsche will present the limited edition model in time for the 50th anniversary of the 911 at the IAA motor show in Frankfurt, which opens its gates to the public on September 12, 2013. In 1963, Porsche presented the original model to the public at this leading international show for the automotive industry. Since its first presentation - initially as the type 901 - the sports car icon has excited automotive fans across the globe, and today it is considered the reference for all other sports cars. Since making its debut in 1963, the model series has progressively developed without interruption. In the process, the unique character of the 911 was always

preserved. The result of this evolution over a 50-year period – which included countless race victories as well – is a sports car that fully embodies the authenticity of the Porsche brand. Its DNA is reflected in all Porsche models.

This limited edition of the 400 hp (294 kW) 911 Carrera S includes features that have contributed to the 50-year success story of the 911. For example, the limited edition includes Porsche Active Suspension Management (PASM) with special tuning to complement its increased track width and to add support to the



exceptional cornering dynamics of the 911. The sport exhaust system outputs a fitting emotional sound. Special 20-inch wheels are a visual tribute to the legendary "Fuchs" wheels and are finished in matte black paint with machine-polished centres. Chrome trim strips on the front air inlets, the fins of the engine compartment grille and the panel between the rear lights emphasise the distinctive appearance of this limited edition model. "911 50". This is repeated in three colour embroidery on the headrest and in two colours as a logo on the tachometer and the aluminium door sill plates. It can also be found on the cup holder panel together with the limited edition number of the individual vehicle. Other exterior characteristics of the special model are high-gloss window frames and sport design exterior mirrors on the doors panels.

There are tributes to the original 911 in the interior

colour. The driver and front passenger experience typical 911 driving fun in 14-way sport seats or optional 18-way sport seats plus. The gear shift or selector lever — which matches the decorative panels on the dashboard, doors and centre console in brushed aluminium — comes from the Porsche Exclusive program.

The 911 50th Anniversary Edition sprints from zero to 100 km/h in 4.5 seconds (4.3 with PDK) and can reach a top speed of





Another technical highlight of the car's equipment is the Porsche Dynamic Light System (PDLS) with bi-xenon headlights and dynamic cornering lights.

Two unique colours are available for the anniversary 911, a darker graphite grey and a lighter geyser grey metallic. In addition black monochrome is also available. Each of the cars has a two-tone 3D-effect badge on the rear lid with the numbers

as well: green labelling on the instruments with white pointer needles and silver caps on the instrument pivot pins, just like 50 years ago. Another special feature is the centre panels of the leather seats, which are designed with a fabric pattern reminiscent of the "Pepita" tartan design from the 1960s. The full-leather interior is designed in agate grey or black with decorative stitching, some in contrasting

300 km/h (298 with PDK). The car's NEDC combined fuel consumption is 9.5 I/100 km (8.7 with PDK), which equates to C02 emissions of 224 g/km (205 with PDK). The limited edition models will be available at Porsche dealers on September 23rd, and in Germany will cost 121,119 euros (\$160,349. US) including VAT and country-specific features.




