

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HAPPY FOURTH OF JULY TO ALL!






RALLY — IT'S NOT JUST THE CARS, IT'S THE INSTRUCTIONS!

By the time you read this, the Spring Rally will have been run (driven? completed? finished?), the prizes issued and the memories made. At the time of this writing, the weather looks like it will have been good, and that is half the enjoyment – spending some time with other rallyists in Porsches on a nice morning in June. Look for the report on the Spring rally in the August *Challenge*. For the brief gimmick rally at the end of the poker run, those who solved the word puzzles and went left at every uninstructed "T" intersection did the best, no doubt.

What I can tell you is that the remote, narrow and twisty roads we generally select for our rallies are not so wonderful in inclement weather. Not that we wouldn't run the rally in the rain, but in a severe thunderstorm - probably not such a good idea. Tom Redmerski and I did just that while proofing the spring rally in late May. We encountered a violent, tree-felling T-storm the evening of May 27th in Monroe and Southbury. We were dodging trees (even had to move a medium-sized tree blocking the entire roadway with help from strong young men driving Bimmers), and trying our best to stay on the pavement in the downpour. Fortunately, we had decided to drive Tom's battle-axe Volvo and not one of our Boxsters. We survived, found a few corrections needed in the RIs and the rally was way better for it.

On the following Saturday morning, Bill Turney and I proofed the Poker Run (in good weather), and clarified a few more route instructions as well as corrected the GPS address for the last checkpoint (funny how different GPSs think the same address is in a different place!). We had our own adventure on the way home through Waterbury avoiding the one-lane I-84 construction backup, by touring parts of Forestville and Wolcott, which I probably will never see again in this lifetime.

Flying 3,000 miles to attend a future CVR AutoX may seem like a stretch, but that's exactly what several hoped to encourage with their offers for Jim to co-drive their car any-time he could align his travels. As professed, the May 18th course was the perfect place to practice Steering skills (notably shuffle-steering and throttle steering) and Braking skills (threshold braking, trail-braking, etc.). >>> CVR recommends you attend AutoX-U before your first Drivers Education event. Here you can quickly master the same driving skills like: Trailing Throttle Oversteer, how to correct Understeer, with nothing but a few soft cones around.



Today it seems that if you can find something on the web then there is no need to actually know it, or to figure it out for yourself. Some official sounding web-site will tell you what you need, when you need it. Be forewarned, AutoX-U intends to buck the trend. The July 29th AutoX course is specifically designed to make you think for yourself. To figure out how to drive a new track, a new course, on your own. But as always, AutoX-U will offer some thoughts to help you effectively achieve this vital driving skill, "Course Reading". These tips will help you self-analyze any new track, be it a new autocross course, a go-kart track, Thompson Speedway, or even a fresh look at a favorite track such as Lime Rock or Watkins Glen.

"Save the Manuals"! The second AutoX-U driving skill to be featured is the lost art of "Pedal Work", or dancing on the pedals. It will come in very handy on the June 29th AutoX course which is like none we've made before. See the accompanying course map and you will see why. This is one of those skills best practiced on the street well in advance of the event to truly master with Zen-like smoothness, and to make it a reflex action. Hard to initially master, this is crucial to squeeze time out of the course clock. It's also one of the most rewarding driving skills when done properly and why many of us are so passionate about driving manual shift cars.

COURSE READING (AutoX-U Skill #14)

You don't need to see someone else's "line" to figure out how to get around a new course fast. In fact, that is truly the strength of driving AutoX events verses Drivers Ed events, where the line is so well traveled and published there is no need to have to think for yourself. At any track, you can find someone else's in-car video and a course map showing you exactly where conventional wisdom says you should be at all times. The trouble is when you are confronted with a new track, panic sets in and special attention needs to be given to help you navigate it successfully. Course Reading is a skill that helps avoid that syndrome and ultimately makes you faster than being a line-drone. Here are some thoughts to help you think through a course and figure out what line makes sense for you and your car, how to keep refining it, and how to tell when you have figured it out:

Think backwards. Where do you want your car to be as you exit a curve, and why do you want it there? Do you want to exit this turn with maximum speed (answer "Yes" if it's followed by a straight away)? Or is it more important to position your car for the following curve (answer"Yes" if that next curve is more important to exit with maximum speed, in which case the current curve is a "compromise corner" such as the Left-Hander at Lime Rock)? When you are confronted with a new course, think about the whole track backwards, saying "if I want to end here, then I should start with my car positioned there" and keep working backwards through the whole course in your mind. Please, don't actually walk the course backwards, just think ahead to where you want to exit each corner based on what's next.

Less is more. Ask yourself how you can negotiate a turn with the absolute minimum movement of the steering wheel. How you can link two turns to be taken as one big arc. Did vou take that turn well? Answer for yourself by seeing how well you utilized the full track width in one distinct and smooth steering input that carried you from the turn-in, through the apex, and to the track-out point. If you keep adjusting the steering throughout the turn then try adjusting your line until you can achieve it in one steady and minimal steering angle. Adjust for elevation changes, even small ones by taking advantage of uphill and banked corners (drainage pitch in a parking lot) that compress your suspension giving you extra cornering grip that allows a tighter radius at the same speed; or the opposite, when a downhill or off-camber section de-weights the grip and requires a larger radius.

♦ Shorter is faster. Seemingly in conflict with the other statements, but not in reality. If you can shave off distance, even at the expense of a little momentum, then you usually can shave off time. Think about if the outside of the curve was completely paved (hmmm, like maybe a skid pad, or a parking lot). Would you be faster if you drove around the skid pad with a higher speed but at a larger radius? The short answer is, "No".

You don't need to see someone else's "line" to figure out how to get around a new course fast. In fact that is truly the strength of driving AutoX events verses Drivers Ed events, where the line is so well traveled and published there is no need to have to think for yourself.

▶ Momentum rules. Ask yourself how you can carry as much momentum (velocity) as possible through the turn, but not at the expense of adding a lot of distance. Basically the answer seems to be to go as tight as possible through a turn with the tires slipping only 5% and that is usually the best trade-off between distance and momentum, and the quickest way around the corner. We tend to think our cars have infinite horsepower, or that we can actually fully use the horsepower we have, when

in reality, physics isn't kind to changing velocity or overcoming added distance. Not fast at a go-kart track? You are likely not conserving your momentum as well as you could and/or adding too much distance through the turn. Usually this means you are over-braking into a corner and going too wide, rather than slowing down a little sooner but a little less, cutting down a little distance, and averaging a slightly higher speed throughout the whole turn and exiting with better speed.


PEDAL WORK (AutoX-U Skill #2)

The art of dancing with three pedals, or even two, is truly one of the joys of driving well. But don't dance flatfooted. Dance with smooth violence. Push the pedals with delicate strength. Don't tell your car to be jerky and harsh by your inputs, give it the commands to be settled and quick.



▶ Downshift and brake at the same time. Yes, heel-and-toe downshifts are necessary to drive a manual shift car fast. The hairpin turn on the June 29th AutoX course will require a shift from second to first and is the perfect place to use this skill. While braking hard with your right "toes" (actually the ball of your right foot), dip the clutch and simultaneously blip the gas with your right heel. Before the revs drop, shift from 2nd to 1st gear, then let out the clutch. By that time you should be about finished braking and be ready to get on the gas to exit the corner. This should be practiced until everything is smooth and the car isn't jerky, otherwise the tires can't be at the braking/cornering limit throughout this whole process. Practice, practice, practice on the street until vou don't have to think about it and can do it quickly. Do it right and vou'll be addicted forever. Plus, it's better for your car and the quickest way in and out of a turn that requires a gear change. If your get really good, advance to double-clutch heel-and-toe downshifts! That will make your synchros last forever and increase your addiction to this art-form. In reality, this takes too long for most AutoX turns, but is silky smooth on the street and in high speed sweepers.

Push gently but hard. Think of putting an egg between your foot and the gas pedal. It can take adequate force. but it cannot take being stomped on (recall your high school egg-drop experiment?). When your car is fighting for traction it takes this kind of delicate ramp-up in pedal pressure to keep from upsetting the tire grip. "Roll-on" the gas, it's not an on-off switch. The same applies to the brake pedal pressure. The forces for braking are much greater but they should still be ramped-up, not stomped on. The ramp-up time is brief (maybe a $\frac{1}{4}$ or $\frac{1}{2}$ second) but important because it allows time for the car's weight to transfer to the front, where the brakes are sized to handle this higher load. If you are locking, or chirping your front tires that means

you should give them a split second more ramp-up time before maximum pedal pressure is reached.

▶ Release with the same gentleness. As you release the brake pedal pressure, ramp it down about the same rate that you ramped it up, maybe a little slower. This split second (or so) time allows the weight to return to the back wheels, which is needed to accelerate out of the turn. To correct for the understeer that all cars have, slow down the release rate to "milk it" through most of the corner and keep more weight transferred to the front tires. Releasing the brake pedal pressure for as much as 2/3rds of the corner is not uncommon for tight turns, but for medium speed turns it's common to be releasing the brake pressure up to the apex (then neutral throttle for most of the middle part of the turn, and only roll on the gas as you straighten the steering on exiting the turn).

Since 1983, the East Coast's premier vintage racing and concours event has been the Historic Festival weekend at Lime Rock Park, held annually on Labor Day weekend. No other venue in the U.S. has three days of on-track racing sandwiching a prestigious concours event all on the same property.

In between the two race days is the prestigious Sunday in the Park Concours. For 2014, expect up to 250 cars comprising the Lime Rock Concours d'Elegance, lining the entire length of Sam Posey Straight, from the Downhill to Big Bend. The cars are judged by eminent experts, by class, on the basis of design, rarity, provenance and condition. The remaining mile of track is completely filled with some 750 additional collector cars, displayed by enthusiastic owners in groups according to marque and origin. This Gathering of the Marques is a fascinating, eclectic display, where you can get right up close to everything brought by the clubs, from the Citroen Deux Chevaux to the 300SL Gullwing.



This year you will have the rare opportunity to hear Brithish Racing Legend Sir Stirling Moss and his wife, Lasy Susie Moss. Sir Stirling Craufurd Moss, OBE (born 17 September 1929), raced from 1948 to 1962, winning 212 of the 529 races he entered, including 16 Formula One Grands Prix. He would compete in as many as 62 races in a single year and drove 84 different makes of car over the course of his racing



career, including Cooper 500, ERA, Lotus, Maserati, Mercedes-Benz, Porsche and Vanwall single-seaters, Aston Martin, Ferrari, Jaguar and Mercedes-Benz sports cars, and Jaguar saloons. Like many drivers of the era, he competed in several formulae, often on the same day. He remained the English driver with the most Formula One victories until 1991 when Nigel Mansell overtook him after competing in more races.

This year's Concours will also be a very special one for Porsche fans, as 2014 just happens to be the 60th Anniversary of the introduction of the 356 Speedster and we are expeciting a number of Speedsters in attendance!




